





CONFRONTING SEASONAL

AFFECTIVE DISORDER

Seasonal Affective Disorder or 'winter blues' affects around two million people of any age in the UK each year. How can we confront it and cope this winter.

SEE THE LIGHT!

Most of us have heard of light therapy and one way to do it at home in winter is to sit in front of a light box for up to 2 hours a day. Light boxes give out very bright light at least 10 times stronger than ordinary home and office lighting.

TAKE UP A NEW HOBBY

A new hobby keeps your mind active, and this seems to ward off symptoms of SAD!

SEE YOUR FRIENDS AND FAMILY

It has been shown that socialising is good for your mental health and helps ward off the winter blues. So why not try and keep in touch with people you care about? And accept any invitations!

TALK ABOUT IT

Whether you seek out professional help or the listening ear of a friend, talking can help you cope with symptoms.

JOIN A SUPPORT GROUP

Why not consider joining a support group. Sharing your experience with others can make your symptoms more bearable.

SEEK HELP!

If all else fails, and if your symptoms are so bad that you cannot live a normal life, see your GP for medical help.

Seasonal Affective Disorder can affect many of us, if one of these tips does not work for you, try one of the others.






