



ROOF INSPECTION: A solid roof is your first line of defence against the elements. Call in a professional to check your roof for any damaged or missing tiles. It's better to fix a small issue now than to deal with a huge leak later. FIREPLACE AND CHIMNEY: If you're lucky enough to have a real fireplace, get it ready for those cosy nights in. Make sure the chimney is

clear to avoid any smoke or fire hazards and give the fireplace a good clean before lighting it up. OUTDOOR PLUMBING: Frozen pipes are a big winter headache. Insulate exposed pipes and shut off the water supply to outdoor taps and hoses. Drain any excess water to prevent your pipes freezing, and if you're going away, leave the heating on a low setting to avoid bursts. Insulate, Insulate, Insulate: Insulation is your best friend in winter. Check your walls, floors and loft – heat rises, and you don't want it escaping through the roof.

TEST SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS: Safety first! Test all your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to make sure they're working properly. With windows and doors closed more often, you'll want to be alerted immediately if there are any issues. CONSIDER A SMART THERMOSTAT: If you haven't jumped on the smart home bandwagon, now might be the time. A smart thermostat allows you to control your heating remotely, which can be handy if your plans change suddenly.

There you have it, the ultimate winter maintenance checklist! By giving your home a little extra care and attention, you'll be able to enjoy the season without any unnecessary stress. Now, get that checklist ticked off, so you can sit back, relax, grab a mulled wine and enjoy the Xmas festivities without a care in the world!


